

How to Determine Your Ring Size

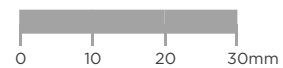
Ring measurements are very precise. Carefully follow these instructions to obtain an accurate measurement.

Step 1: Print out this PDF

- Prior to printing, ensure that Page Scaling is set to “None” on your print dialog box. (To open the print dialog box, press CTRL+P.)

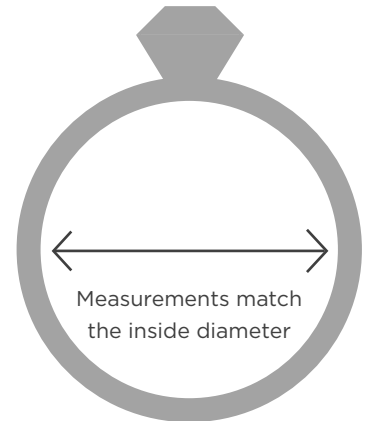
Step 2: Confirm printed paper size

- Measure the bar on the left. It must be exactly 30 mm long.

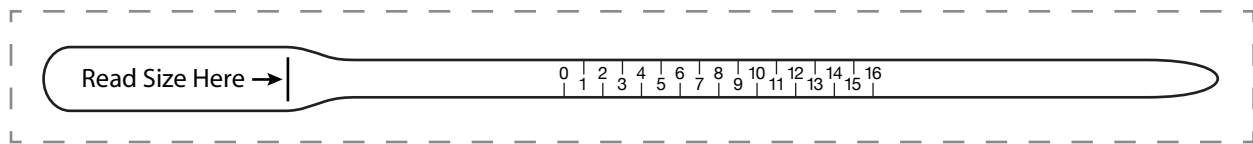


Step 3: Measure an available ring

- Select a ring that comfortably fits the intended finger.
- Place the ring over the circles below, matching the inside edge of the ring to the circle nearest in size. This measurement refers to the *inside diameter* of the ring.
- If the ring falls between two sizes, we recommend you order the larger size.

Alternate Step 3: Measure finger with ring sizer

- a. Cut out the ring sizer above. Cut a small slit next to the arrow.
 - b. Place the ring sizer around your finger, then slip the pointed end through slit with the numbers facing out.
 - c. Tighten the ring sizer by pulling the pointed end toward your finger. The fit should be snug but comfortable.
 - d. Simply read the number pointed to by the arrow next to “Read Size Here”.
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Tips for measuring your finger

- Rings should fit your finger comfortably. They should be tight enough as to not fall off, but loose enough to slide over your knuckle.
- Measure your finger at the end of the day and when they're warm since your fingers are smaller earlier in the day and when they're cold.
- Measure your finger 3-4 times to eliminate any chance of an inaccurate reading.

Buying a gift for someone?

One of the most important aspects of a ring is fit. Be sure to ask if the ring you are considering can be resized, as some designs cannot be altered once they are finished. Here are some suggestions to help you find the perfect size:

- *Secretly borrow a ring* that your gift recipient doesn't wear every day. Take it to your local jeweler and ask them to tell you what size the ring is. One hand is usually slightly larger than the other, so it is even better if you can find a ring that he/she wears on the hand you intend to purchase the ring for.
- If you cannot borrow one of their rings, *trace the inside diameter* of one instead. Then, lay it over one of the rings from our sizing kit to find the perfect fit.
- *Ask a friend or family member* if they know what size your gift recipient is.
- If you are shopping for a ring together, figuring out the fit becomes easier. To be safe, you should still visit a *jeweler to determine their size*. The ring should fit snugly over their knuckle, without being uncomfortable.
